WE ARE A 501(C)(3) DOG RESCUE CREATING A BETTER FUTURE FOR HOMELESS AND MISTREATED DOGS IN SOUTH KOREA.

A REVIEW OF 2023

As we reflect on the journey of 2023, Korean K9 Rescue remains steadfastly committed to activism and reform and rescuing, rehabilitating, and rehoming dogs from South Korea and locally. This year, our efforts have been particularly impactful, marked by significant rescue operations and strides toward legislative reforms on the dog meat ban, puppy mill auction houses, and welfare reform.

Our 2023 rescue operations by our team in Korea included multiple large-scale raids against illegal puppy mills and dog slaughterhouses, saving thousands of lives together with our partners and highlighting the dire conditions these animals face. We rescued these dogs and provided them with the necessary medical care and rehabilitation to prepare them for a new life where they were all adopted into loving families across the US.

In addition to our rescue efforts, we have made significant advances in our advocacy for animal welfare. With the support of our community and through partnerships with local organizations,



we've pushed for changes in legislation and public awareness about the inhumane practices of the dog meat trade and the cruelty of puppy mills. Each week that passes, the Korean government moves closer to a final vote on banning the dog meat trade forever.

We also celebrated heartwarming adoption stories and received support through grants and fundraising events, bolstering our capacity to care for more animals effectively and rescue even more needy dogs.

Thank you to everyone who has supported our mission this year. Your continued commitment helps us move closer to a world where dogs in Korea can live free from suffering. We look forward to continuing our work in 2024 and beyond, driven by compassion and the collective effort of our supportive community and rescue partners.



A LETTER FROM THE FOUNDER

Dear Friends and Supporters,

As we close another year at Korean K9 Rescue, I'm filled with gratitude and a renewed sense of purpose. The challenges we faced in 2023 tested our resolve and deepened our commitment to rescuing, rehabilitating, and re-homing dogs from South Korea. Thanks to your support, we made the most significant strides toward ending the inhumane dog meat trade and improving animal welfare laws for puppy mills and the auction houses that sell them.

This year, we witnessed profound moments of compassion and victory from within Korea. Our team in Korea shut down a notorious dog slaughterhous in Siheung city, and in the most historic rescue in South Korean history - they helped rescue over 1,400 dogs on Sept 1st, in Hwaseong city shutting down an entire illegal puppy mill, each rescue has been a testament to what we can achieve together. These missions are not just about saving lives; they are about changing the narrative, ensuring a kinder future in Korea for all animals, and pushing for welfare and reform for dogs to not be sold as products for profit and greed.

Our advocacy efforts have been more vigorous than ever. KK9R in Korea have been at the forefront of puppy mill protests, demanding changes in legislation and shining a light on the cruelty. They have rallied for support from industry professionals calling for changes in the puppy mill industry and protesting auction houses to expose the monopoly of greed.



I truly believe with the implementation of Lucy's Law, a new puppy mill bill proposed to the Korean government, we could stop so much suffering caused by the selling of sick and abused dogs for greed. This year alone, three hundred and twenty two adopters embraced and adopted our dogs in New York, Los Angeles, Boston, and the greater NY tri-state area with great compassion, giving them thriving new lives!

Thank you for being part of this journey. Your support not only fuels our daily operations but also bolsters our spirits and helps save previous lives. You remind us that we can overcome challenges and create lasting changes in Korea and globally. Thank for building a kinder community through adoption.





RESCUE MISSIONS IN 2023 BY KK9R IN KOREA



SAVED 53 INSIDE HOARDER HOUSE

Q GWANGJU, KOREA - JANUARY

After our rescue partner, received reports of an elderly woman and her paralyzed husband keeping 53 dogs in their tiny home, ridden with trash, team KK9R in Korea, couldn't help but to step in. After much negotiation and reasoning with the elderly couple, they were able to save all 53 souls, and shared the rescue efforts with other rescue partners. They also contacted local social services to make sure the couple was taken care of with dignity as well.

31 DOGS SAVED FROM ILLEGAL PUPPY MILL

O NAMYANGJU, KOREA - MAY

With combined efforts from rescue partners KK9R in Korea managed to shut down an illegal puppy mill. Despite the puppy mill owners efforts to conceal most of the dogs, the team found them hidden in a neighbor's home and rescued them all. Team KK9R also destroyed the cages so the puppy mill could not continue. 31 dogs were all saved and adopted to loving homes in NYC.



SHUTDOWN SLAUGHTERHOUSE

SIHEUNG, KOREA - JUNE

In collaboration with another rescue partner, KK9R in Korea shut down the Siheung dog slaughterhouse, a notorious hub for illegal dog meat distribution in Korea. Tragically, three dogs were found dead by the raid, while 24 survivors bore witness to unspeakable brutality, awaiting their turn to gruesome slaughter. After the rescue, our focus shifted to ensuring accountability for the butcher through prosecution and providing extensive care and rehabilitation for these traumatized animals. Towards the end of the year and into the new, we witnessed our survivors start to find loving forever homes in NYC.

RESCUED ZOMBIE DOGS

PAJU CITY, KOREA - JUNE

On June 5th, team KK9R in Korea uncovered a dire situation: over 50 dogs living in squalor, infected with parasites, while an elderly woman struggled to care for them alone. Despite rescue efforts, it took Paju City 12 days to relocate the elderly woman, leaving these dogs, dubbed "Zombie Dogs," because of their horrible skin condition. KK9R in Korea rescued 17 of them, but their contagious skin conditions posed challenges and significant costs to provide proper care. Eventually all dogs went to rescue and the eldery woman went to assisted living.





SHUT DOWN PUPPY MILL

BORYEONG, KOREA - AUGUST

Over 500 dogs were saved with the help of our rescue partners from the horrible abuse of an illegal breeder in Boryeong city. With this rescue mission, it was uncovered that the Oriental Dog Auction House provided support and revenue to horrendous puppy mill breeders in the area. KK9R in Korea and its partners saved every dog from this mill. They also ensured the puppy mill was demolished.

LARGEST ILLEGAL PUPPYMILL SHUTDOWN IN SOUTH KOREA

• HWAESONG, KOREA - SEPTEMBER

1,426 lives. That's how many precious lives were saved from Korea's largest puppy mill to be shut down in history. KK9R in Korea found bodies kept in freezers, wrapped in newspaper, tossed aside and abandoned; a scene made of pure horror. It took a large team effort with support from 21 additional rescue groups and in collaboration with Governor Kim Dong-yeon of Gyonggi-do <a>@kimdongyeon_dy. This historic mission was executed in 48 hours on Sept 1, 2023 and will remain etched in our hearts forever. The sheer number of suffering mothers are fathers who needed our help changed theirs and our lives forever. Over 60 of these dogs found forever homes in the NYC area shortly after rescue.



RESCUE OF 11 TOSA INUS FROM THE DOG MEAT TRADE

SEJONG CITY, KOREA - NOVEMBER

In the last week of November, Korean dog meat farmers dumped 11 Tosa Inus, crammed into small cages, in front of the Sejong City Assembly. This cruel act was a protest against new legislation aimed at banning the dog meat trade in Korea. As the fight for this legislation began, our Korean K9 Rescue team in Korea couldn't ignore these dogs, who were being used as political pawns. The dogs were taken to the Sejong City shelter, where they were left chained, sick, scared, and alone. Witnessing their suffering, our team, along with our partners, acted swiftly to secure their release. All 11 Tosas are now safe and are undergoing training and rehabilitation. We are working towards finding each of them a loving home.











ACTIVISM IN 2023



CALL FOR ACTION TO END MORAN DOG MEAT MARKET

SEONGNAM-SI, KOREA - AUGUST

In our ongoing efforts to advocate for the welfare of animals, we have witnessed continued challenges in closing Moran Dog Meat Market and ending dog consumption. Despite promises made by the Livestock Innovation Cooperative, subsidized for five years, they have broken their commitment and engaged in illegal activities, disregarding citizen protests against the slaughter. Authorities have shown passivity, merely notifying the cooperative head about subsidy removal. Shockingly, our taxes, intended to prevent dog slaughter, have been misused to transport and illegally slaughter dog corpses. Our demands include disbanding the Livestock Innovation Cooperative, holding perpetrators accountable, revoking all subsidies and banning dog corpse distribution in Moran Market by Gyeonggi Province and Seongnam City, and ultimately, a nationwide ban on dog consumption by the South Korean Government.

We were joined by over 500 citizens and 23 other animal rescue groups as we rallied and marched against the Moran Dog Meat Market. "End the dog meat trade!" filled the streets of Seongnam City for hours accompanied by banners and signs urging the government to do their part.

PROTEST AT NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BUILDING TO END DOG MEAT TRADE

SEOUL, KOREA - OCTOBER

In October, we joined a significant protest at the National Assembly Building in Seoul, South Korea, to end the dog meat trade. Accompanied by 27 rescue groups and over 500 citizens, we utilized Instagram Live to broadcast the event, reaching a broader audience and amplifying our message. Through peaceful demonstration, we voiced opposition to the inhumane practice and advocated for compassion towards animals. We remain dedicated to collaborating with others until every animal is treated with the dignity they deserve.





PROTEST THE ORIENTAL DOG AUCTION HOUSE

Q YU-SEONG, KOREA

Joined by <u>@Youumbba</u>, <u>@animal_kara</u>, and <u>@kdsrescue</u>, we raised our voices against the inhumane acts of Puppymills. By only showing the public "sale-ready" animals, Puppy mills in Yu-seong are concealing the horrible conditions most of their dogs are kept in. We stand against the cruelty of puppy mills and will continue to fight for those without a voice.





DOG MEAT BAN FINALLY PROPOSED

SOUTH KOREA

The moment we've all been waiting for has finally hit the council. The South Korean government has strategized for substantial change, such as removing canines from the livestock category and imposing penalties for any illegal activities involving dog meat. By 2024, dog meat trade entities must submit a detailed plan on their closing of operations gearing up for a complete ban on new farms and slaughterhouses in 2027. We have a long three years ahead of this, but this law is a monumental change in protecting millions of dog lives.


MIDSUMMER PARTY RAISED OVER \$50K

In July, our team uncovered harrowing realities in a recent mission, prompting a rescue raid intervention spotlighted by SBS Animal. We confronted a brutal dog butcher in Siheung, whose covert operations were exposed through diligent surveillance by our partners at Animal KARA. This led to a daring rescue by our Korean K9 Rescue and KARA teams, revealing violations against Korea's Animal Protection Act.

Our brave manager in Korea faced legal challenges that are still ongoing, highlighting her courage and bravery. The journey for the 20+ rescued dogs begins as they recover from severe health conditions, including parvo. Our team has rehabilitated all the dogs and adopted almost all of them into loving forever homes in the US! Only a few more remain at our center, and they will arrive in the US after more rehab.





